

Exclusion

So, you were excluded.

Is it because they hate you, they dislike you, you do not measure up, you are not smart enough, you are not fun, you do not have enough money, or what?

Whenever people are not included they seem to jump to conclusions, and their endless tapes go around and around as to why they were excluded and what is wrong with them. People lose sleep and change their lives over being excluded. It can create long hurt and resentment. Too often, it is not spoken and festers in the background causing mental and even physical problems and issues.

Yes, at times we are all 'excluded' from something. It happens to everyone.

First, is it exclusion? Sure, it can be. Most often, it is not.

For example:
